Atlantic City Is Monumental

Known mainly for the beach and Boardwalk, rolling chairs, casinos and world-class entertainment, Atlantic City is also home to some of the most exceptional memorials dedicated to the memory and struggles of humankind. These gems include a **World War I Memorial** that was modeled after a Greek Temple with the names of battles in which Atlantic City soldiers fought in are etched along the top of the rotunda.

The **Korean War Memorial** features a 12-foot sculpture of "The Mourning Soldier" as well as an eternal flame dedicated to the 822 New Jerseyans who fought and lost their lives or declared missing in action. "In **The Line of Duty**" includes a steel I-beam from the World Trade Center's North Tower containing floor joist and concrete from the original building and **The Civil Rights Garden** is a one-of-a-kind tribute honoring the long journey of African Americans to achieve freedom and equal rights.

Place Your Bets

Atlantic City's land-based **sportsbooks** are where the excitement truly is. With eight of Atlantic City's nine casinos offering sports betting, fans can pick their favorites, relax in plush seats and enjoy the action. With the venues offering multiple LED screens, no sporting event is likely to be missed, so come hang out with friends — old and new. You could be a winner!

An Oldie But Goodie

No conversation about Atlantic City is complete without mentioning the world's first **Boardwalk**. Originally built in 1870 measuring 10 feet wide in sections of 12 feet, its purpose was to serve as a means to keep sand out of the luxurious beachfront hotels and railroad passenger cars. Today, the famous wooden walkway is more than four miles in length and 60 feet across at its widest points and attracts millions of visitors.

Live Love Loop

Don't let a trip to Atlantic City come to an end without visiting The Orange Loop. Named for the orange properties on the Monopoly game board (New York Avenue, Tennessee Avenue and St. James Place), The Orange Loop is three beach blocks of one-of-a-kind restaurants, bars, live music, coffee, yoga and more.
